In this exclusive interview with CSP Ugbotor, he shares his transformational journey and the impact he's made so far.

Q: Can you introduce yourself and share your experience in Lagos State Police Command and Police College?

We also acquired modern musical apparatus and a generator, thanks to the support of our partners, including Mountain of Fire Miracles Ministries and Church of Pentecost. The then Commissioner of Police, now AIG Zone 2, AIG Mustapha Adegoke, graciously accepted our request and re-roofed the chapel.

Q: What's your relationship like with civilian chaplaincy groups?

CSP Ezekiel Ugbotor: We maintain good relationships with civilian chaplaincy groups, and they partner with us in our ministry. We encourage them to share in our vision and support our efforts. Chaplaincy is not just for the police; it's also for civilians. We believe in working together to make a broader impact.

Q: Can you describe your relationship with the Christian Police Fellowship of Nigeria (CPFN)?

Q: You've shown caring for police widows by giving mattress, pillows, and providing scholarships to late police officers' children. Who are your civilian pillars in supporting these initiatives?

CSP Ezekiel Ugbator: My civilian supporters are too numerous to mention. Just as I have mentioned a few church groups and organizations, there are also individuals like the one that gave widows foam and pillows. One of our partners, a sole distributor of Mouka Foam, felt that these widows need to have a better life. He gave out 17 pieces of foams and 40 pieces of pillows, which was shared to widows. Other individuals, like Rev. Esther Nwofia and the owner of Lapo Microfinance, have been of great support to us.

"What is your relationship with the Police recruits you've been mentoring, Chaplain CSP Ezekiel Ugbator?"

We are doing a remarkable job by nurturing Police recruits at Police College Ikeja, Lagos, to be God-fearing individuals. With the support of the Commissioner of Police, CP Omolara Ibidun Oloruntola a devoted woman of God, she's also molding them develop into amiable police officers who will positively impact the Nigeria Police Force and society as a whole.
