Gentle, soft spoken but highly articulate and dreadful to criminals, CP Olohundare has continued to pilot the affairs of the Command in alignment with the vision and policing policy of IGP Kayode Egbetokun. His purposeful leadership style, which is leading by example from the rear and his proper coordination of officers and men, made the job result oriented.

On assumption of office as the 41st Commissioner of Police for Lagos Command on

Tuesday, 18th February, 2025, Olohundare in his inaugural speech clearly emphasized his commitment to enhance policing and public safety. He acknowledged the concerns of Lagos residents regarding security and pledged to ensure safety and protection of citizens.

Perhaps, some criminal elements still marauding as champion, misunderstood the CP's pledge of protection of citizens, believing they will also be protected.

Responding to the concerns of residents, Olohundare wasted no time by hitting the ground running, evolving uncanny strategies to fulfill his pledge.

While alluding to this asertion, CP Olohundare said, "We have adopted preventive strategies that keep us ahead of criminals. Lagosians now go about their lawful activities in peace, sleeping with their eyes closed."

He however credited the Lagos State Governor, Mr. Babajide Sanwo-Olu for providing the state-of-the-art crime-fighting equipment, logistics, and technology.

Several novel strategies were evolved notably, a Special Intervention Squad (SIS) headed by a Chief Superintendent of Police (CSP) was set up to serve

as a go-between in the event of any outbreak of crisis.

In addition, the existing CP Tactical Teams were beefed up with the creation of five additional teams, which include a team tagged "Blue Line", personally christened by the Commissioner of Police himself, curtail criminal elements across the Blue Rail Line and its environs.

To walk his talk, Olohundare immediately convened a strategic meeting, where he gave a matching order to all the Tactical Commanders to double their efforts at ensuring that crime is further reduced to the barest minimum under his watch.

As promised during his inaugural speech that "the state will be too hot henceforth for the men of the under-world and it will be a no-go area for criminals and their cohorts".

The matching order has served as a tonic for the Commanders, prompting them to fight like a wounded lion, in line with the laid out strategies of the CP. They've tactfully went after the criminals, took the fight to their door steps, winning the battle convincingly.

A core professional, a seasoned intelligent officer with liberal mind, who police with the fear of God, CP Jimoh, who hails from Ilorin, Kwara State, studied Political Science at Ahmadu Bello University before joining the Nigeria Police Force as a Cadet Assistant Superintendent of Police in 2000.

His career has seen him serve in various capacities across the country, including postings in Katsina, Cross River, Anambra, the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Oyo, Gombe, and Rivers states.

Notably, he has served as Divisional Police Officer (DPO) at Central Police Station, Abuja; Force Public Relations Officer; Deputy Commissioner, Criminal Investigation Department, Airport Police Command; Deputy Commissioner, Finance and Administration, Oyo State Police Command; and Deputy Commissioner, General Investigation, FCID Annex, Gombe. Until his latest appointment, he was the Commissioner of Police at the Ports

Authority Police, Eastern Ports, Port Harcourt.

CP Jimoh has undergone extensive professional training, both locally and internationally. Some of his training includes the Combat Operations Course at the Police Mobile Training College, Maiduguri; Weapons of Mass Destruction Countermeasure First Responder Training Course at the United States Embassy, Abuja; and various strategic courses in South Korea and China, including anti-hijacking techniques, maritime rescue operations, and social management reforms.

A recipient of numerous awards, CP Jimoh was recognised with the Presidential Award for Public Relations Personality of the Year by the Nigerian Institute of Public Relations for his outstanding contributions to public relations within the Nigeria Police Force.

He also served in the African Union Peacekeeping Mission in Darfur, Sudan, where he received an Award of Recognition for Commendable Service.

He is a Fellow of the Institute of Management Consultants (IMC), Nigeria, a Certified Management Consultant (CMC), and a Fellow of the Institute of Corporate Administration of Nigeria. He is also an Associate of the Advertising Regulatory Council of Nigeria (ARCON) and a Member of the Nigerian Institute of Public Relations.

Spectacular Breakthroughs & Achievements.

While reeling out the spectacular breakthroughs and successes of the Command under the watch of





CP Olohundare Moshood Jimoh under the period in review, it is important to note that the successes are not limited to the under listed arrests and recoveries. They are numerous to be captured in one edition, even as they were under reported by the media.

Arrest Of 50 Suspected Cultists

In curbing the menace of cultism in some parts of the State, the Lagos State Police Command sustained its onslaught on cultism. Within the first week of assumption of office, no fewer than 50 suspected cultists were arrested in the acts and arraigned in court for prosecution.

Parades Of 36 Recovered Stolen Exotic Cars, 82 Firearms

No fewer than 36 stolen vehicles have been recovered by operative of the Lagos State Police Command in a covert operations.

In the same vein 82 assorted firearms and different calibres of ammunition were recovered from criminals, which include armed robbers and cultists.

The Commissioner of Police Lagos State Command Olohundare Moshood Jimoh made the

disclosure Wednesday at a media briefing on the achievements of the Command held at the Command's headquarters, Ikeja.

Aside the 36 vehicles, the Police boss informed that there 70 others still under going investigation but can not be brought to the parade ground due to immobility.

He explained that some of the vehicles were snatched from other States and other their way to other countries through the borders or removed from parks in Lagos.

Jimoh attributed the breakthroughs to the crime prevention and control, and other strategies adopted by the Command since his assumption of office to ensure residents sleep with their eyes closed.

Disclosing that some of the suspected cultists are currently in police custody, Jimoh assured that they will be prosecuted on completion of various





investigations into their cases.

His words, " Let me gladly welcome you all to today's press briefing to show case achievements recorded by the Lagos State Police Command in crime prevention, control, and management throughout Lagos State. When I came on board as the Commissioner of Police, Lagos State, new crime prevention and tactics were put in place and implemented to turn around the operation modalities of the command for prompt prevention and detection of crimes and criminality throughout Lagos State.

"This is to ensure the safety of lives and property of all Lagosians and equally ensure that the huge investment of the federal government of Nigeria, the Lagos State government, and that of local and foreign investors are safe and secure for commerce activities and other economic businesses and grow

peacefully throughout the length and breadth of the state.

"This press briefing dwells on a lot of achievements that have been recorded by the Lagos State Police Command, crime prevention and control, and other strategies that we have adopted to ensure that Lagosians go home and sleep in their troops and clothes.

"This is on the recovery of stolen vehicles from Where Parked in Lagos. And those vehicles that were stolen or snatched from other states of the Federation. Some of these vehicles that are recovered today are in the process of being taken outside this country to the borders in Lagos State.

"Quite a number of assorted firearms and ammunition were equally recovered from the cultists and other men of the underworlds in Lagos State. Some of these cultists are currently in police custody and they are going to be prosecuted on completion of various investigations

into their cases.

"These vehicles that we are seeing here today are 36 in number. They are exotic vehicles. Some of them are into several millions, hundreds of millions of Naira.

"They were recovered from fraudulent transactions and advance fee frauds. Some of them were recovered from those who snatched them from other states and tried to pass them through Lagos State to get them out of the country. They are equally part of the vehicle that drivers who are trusted to be in charge of those vehicles decided to take away from their owners.

"Some of them have been sold and we recover them from where they have been sold to and some of them are still in possession of them. We recover them equally. We equally retrieve some of them

from some of the hoodlums that have taken possession of them criminally from the owners.

"I want to let you know that this 36 is presented to you because of lack of space. We still have about 70 others that are immobile. One way or the other, their cases are currently under investigation.

"So I hereby want to call on all Lagosians and visitors to Lagos and in the neighbouring states whose vehicles were stolen at gunpoint or removed from their park or taken away by their drivers to come to the command headquarters for identification and collection."

End Of Road As Police Busts Lagos Most Wanted Hire Killer, Recovers Assorted Sophisticated Firearms, Ammunition

End finally came the way of the most wanted vicious and notorious hired killer, one Wasiu Akinwande (a.k.a Olori Eso) following his unexpected arrest by Tactical Squad of the Lagos State Police Command at the weekend.

Our correspondent reliably gathered that the 44 years old notorious hired killer and head of killers gang cum cultists kingpin was apprehended in his hideout on Friday, in the Agbado area of Ogun State after several attempts by the Police Tactical Squad led by CSP Sunday Cirman in a well-coordinated special operation code-named Silence, Speed and Surprise.

Assorted sophisticated firearms which include two AK-49 rifles, one K2 assault rifle, a red ryder rifle, three pump action rifles, two locally made single barrel pistols were reportedly recovered from the suspects.

Other offensive exhibits which include five magazines, 57 live cartridges, twenty seven 9MM



ammunition, one expended 5.56 ammunition, one dagger, three walkie talkies, nine international passports of different individuals were also recovered from him.

The arrest of the suspect brought to an end his over a decade reign of terror, as he was alleged along side his gangs to have terrorised residents of Mushin and its environs from 2009 until 2024.

The Lagos State Police Command Spokesperson CSP Benjamin Hundeyin who confirmed the report in a release, hinted that Wasiu Akinwande is currently in Police custody under heavy security and will face the full weight of the law for all his crimes.

According to Hundeyin, four families have already came forward to identify him as the suspect behind the killings of their children and wards.

The release reads, "The Lagos State Police Command wishes to inform the general public of a significant breakthrough in its relentless fight against crime of violence and other criminalities in Lagos State. Today, June 20, 2025, Tactical Squad operatives of the Command successfully in a well-coordinated special operation code-named Silence, Speed and Surprise trailed and arrested Wasiu Akinwande aka Olori Eso, a 44-year-old

notorious hired killer and head of killers gang and cultist kingpin who along with his multiple gangs and hoodlums have been terrorizing Mushin area of Lagos State and its environs.

"This serial killer suspect is the most wanted suspect in Lagos history in recent time. His arrest marks a huge success in the ongoing fight against violent crimes that are threats to security and safety of residents in Mushin and some other parts of Lagos State.

"Wasilu Akinwande was arrested in his hideout in the Agbado area of Ogun State after several attempts by the Police Tactical Squad.

"For over a decade now from 2009 until 2024, Wasilu Akinwande and his gangs have terrorized the people and communities, particularly in the Mushin area of Lagos State.

"He was responsible for organizing and executing series of armed robberies, cold blooded murders, kidnappings and cult-related killings. His reign of terror instilled fear and apprehension in residents and posed a dangerous threat to law and order.

"Akinwande's criminal activities have left trauma, horror, agony and pains in the families of victims of his numerous high-profile crimes under investigation by the Lagos State Police Command.

"Despite his escapes from one state of the country to another over the years, the Lagos State Police Command remained resolute in its pursuit of Justice.



"The operatives of the Command raided his house in Mushin, and recovered cache of weapons and incriminating items he freely admitted he was using for his killing operations with his gang.

"The firearms recovered include: Two (2) AK-47 rifles, One (1) K2 Assault rifle, One (1) Red Ryder rifle, Three (3) pump action rifles, Two (2) locally made single-barrel pistols, Five (5) magazines, Fifty-seven (57) live cartridges, Seventy (70) 5.56 live ammunition, Twenty-seven (27) 9mm ammunition, One (1) expended 5.56 ammunition, One (1) dagger, Three (3) walkie-talkies and Nine (9) international passports belonging to different individuals.

Lagos Police Bursts Trafficking Syndicate, Rescues 27 Ghanians, Beninois

Police operatives in Lagos have burst a human trafficking syndicate, rescuing no fewer than 27 victims from the criminal gang.

The victims, identified to be 18 male and 19 female in number, were said to have hailed from Ghana and Benin republic.

The Spokesperson of the Lagos State Police Command CSP Benjamin Hundeyin who made the disclosure in a release on Wednesday stated that all the suspects are staff of an educational consultancy located in Ago Okota area of the State.

According to him, "The case which was initially reported at the Ago Okota Division was subsequently transferred to the SCID for further investigation.

"Preliminary investigation revealed that the suspects, all staff of an educational consultancy located in Ago Okota, fraudulently obtained a total of N500 million from over 100 unsuspecting victims under the false promise of securing Canadian and Australian work visas for them.

"Further investigations revealed that the syndicate includes additional accomplices; and efforts are ongoing to apprehend them and bring them to justice upon conclusion of the investigation".

Lagos Police Smashes Cartel Of Fuel Truck Hijackers, Arrests 7 Suspects, Recovers Tanker Load Of Stolen Fuel

Crack detectives and special operatives of the Lagos State Police Command have successfully cracked a vicious and notorious gang of hijackers of fuel and goods trucks.

No fewer fewer than seven suspects were reportedly arrested in connection with the alleged criminal act.

It was also gathered hijacked tanker loaded with stolen fuel were recovered by the eagle eyes

Addressing a press conference on the achievements of the Command in the last two weeks, the Lagos State Police Command public relations officers CSP Benjamin Hundeyin disclosed that the victims were rescued at an apartment in Isheri Oshun area of the State.

He added that the victims were to be trafficked out of the country by their agent.

Hundeyin, who briefed the press on behalf of Commissioner of Police, CP Jimoh Moshood said, "As soon as the Police received the information, operatives moved into the area and rescued the victims who were locked up in an apartment in the area.

"Among the rescued were 18 male and 19 Female, some of them were Ghanaian and some are from Benin Republic".

He added that preliminary investigations revealed that they were all lured into the country under the guise of getting them jobs.

Lagos Police Busts N500m Visa Scam Syndicates, Arrests 4 Suspects

Police operatives attached to the State Criminal Investigation Department (SCID) of the Lagos State Police Command have bust a syndicates of Visa racketeering scam and fake promise of employment abroad, arresting four suspects in connecting with the crime.

The suspects identified as Blessing Wefutu, 27, Chineye Christian, 36, Archibong Udemefere 'm' aged 23, and Maurine Peter, 25 and others had fraudulently obtained a total of N500 million from over 100 unsuspecting victims under the false promise of securing Canadian and Australian work



operatives, just as they uncovered a filling station being used for the criminal act.

The Police Spokesperson of the Lagos State Command CSP Benjamin Hundeyin who made the disclosure in a release on Saturday, stated that the suspects were arrested in Ejigbo area of the State.

According to him, "At about 6:00 AM today, June 28, 2025, the driver of an hijacked tanker loaded with 45,000 liters of fuel reported at Surulere Police Division the hijacking of the 45,000-liter tanker laden with Premium Motor Spirit (PMS) he was driving in transit through Alaka, Surulere, Lagos to his destination.

"Crack detectives and special operatives of the Lagos Police Command swiftly responded and commenced investigation, leading to the recovery of the hijacked tanker, which was found empty at Orile area of Lagos.

"The Police teams promptly swung into action, immediate response and discreet investigation into the case led the operatives to a filling station in Ejigbo, where the stolen PMS had been offloaded. Upon arrival at the scene, officers discovered another tanker being loaded with the same product stolen from the hijacked tanker.

"Seven (7) suspects namely: Izuchukwu Nwanoruo 'm' aged 34, a business man from Ejigbo; Kayode Falodun 'm' aged 29, a tricycle rider from Ejigbo; Ojo Ayodele 'm' aged 35, a mechanic from Ijegan Ijododo; Ayomide Thompson 'm' aged 24, a graphics designer from Ijegan Ijododo; Ahmed Salisu 'm' aged 37, a driver from Ejigbo; Igbalaye Kareem 'm' aged 38, a trader from Ogun State; and Babatunde Ahmed 'm' aged 38, a driver from Ejigbo, involved in this criminal act were promptly arrested at the filling station.

"Additionally, the fuel tanker being used to transport away the stolen fuel has been recovered to the Police Station as exhibit. The suspects are currently in Police custody and assisting the police with ongoing investigations."



Lagos Police Thwarts Planned Cultism Day Mayhem, Arrests 52 Suspects

No fewer than 52 suspected cultists have been apprehended by Police operatives in Lagos ahead the July 7, 2024 - a day often characterized by mayhem, chaos and killings by different violent cult groups against each other in violent celebration of the day.

The suspects were reportedly arrested on Sunday in joint raids of cultists hideouts while they were in preparation to unleash mayhem on innocent people during the 7:7 Cultism Day.

The spokesperson of the Lagos State Police Command CSP Benjamin Hundeyin in a release assured that the Command is fully prepared and has fully mobilized the Police Anti Cultism Squads, Special Tactical Squads, the Police Mobile Force (PMF), the Police State Intelligence Department and specially designated units of the Force against violent crimes and cultism to prevent, arrest and prosecute any cultist or gang of cultists before they unleash mayhem, havoc and destruction on lives and property.

He hinted that the Command has deployed massively



across the length and breadth of the Lagos State to guarantee the safety of lives and property of all residents and visitors to Lagos State.

According to the statement, the Commissioner of Police, Lagos State Command, CP Olohundare Jimoh, hereby issues a stern warning to hotel owners, managers of recreational facilities, and other establishments to refrain from allowing their premises to be used for meetings, gatherings and other violent activities by cult groups.

The full weight of the law will be fully applied on violators of the law.

Jimoh equally advised parents and guardians to prevail and counsel their children and wards to steer clear of cultism and all forms of violence and criminalities.

Successes In Month of July 2025 At A Glance

* Arrest Of 68 Suspected Criminals Over Alleged Murder, Armed Robbery, Cultism, Unlawful Possession of Firearms, Vehicle Theft, Impersonation, Advanced Gee Fraud

* Dismantling Of N500million Visa Fraud Syndicate

* Recovery of 17 Assorted Firearms Comprising Of Locally Made Pistols, English Revolvers, Natetta Pistols and High-calibre Rifles Such As AK-49

* Four vehicles: a Toyota Camry, a Mercedes-Benz E350, a Lexus hybrid SUV, and a Suzuki minibus linked to "one chance" robbery gangs.

* Electronics: over 20 mobile phones, six laptops, and incriminating items linked to robbery and fraud cases.

* Arrest of four armed robbers who abducted a 16-year-old boy, extorted ₦2 million, and stole his phone before abandoning him.

* Tracking of suspect to Ogun State and arresting a car theft syndicate that recruited drivers to steal employers' vehicles within weeks of hire. Stolen cars were dismantled in Ladipo Market and sold as spare parts.

* A robbery suspect in Ejibbo, Ogun State, linked to the theft of ₦5 million from a Lagos resident. Recovered exhibits included a Toyota 4Runner, bulletproof vest, and POS machines.

* Dismantling of two "one chance" gangs intercepted during surveillance operations in Surulere and near the National Stadium. Suspects used commercial vehicles to pick unsuspecting passengers, rob them at knifepoint or with crude weapons, and drain their bank accounts before abandoning them.

* Recovery of operational vehicles, machetes, axes, and stolen cash from the gangs.

While not resting on his oars, CP Olohundare assured Lagosians that the command will sustain its momentum against crime, urging the public to provide timely intelligence to aid police operations.

In his submission on the overview of crime situation in the state, CP Olohundare said, "crime situation in Lagos is not alarming, but under firm control of the Lagos State Police Command.

* Promises Scholarship For Science Students

* Distributes Branded Exercise Books To Over 1,000 Students, Pupils

The chairman of Apapa Iganmu LCDA in Lagos State, Hon. Jimoh Saliu has reiterated his commitment to academic excellence, just as he promised to offer full scholarship to 50 students of the council area that gain admission to study science courses in higher institutions from next academic session.

Jimoh made the promise, even as he distributed free exercise books to over 1,000 students and pupils participating in the ongoing holiday coaching tagged "Olugbani Summer Classes" at Irekari Nursery and Primary School, Sari Iganmu and Irete-Owaseni Nursery and Primary School Badia, Ijora.

The council boss emphasised that the idea

behind the Summer Classes was to catch the students at young age and prepared them for the future.

Emphasizing that education is the best legacy and bed rock of any developed nation, Jimoh stressed that he intends to transform the local government academically in order to compete favourably with others.

His words, "The idea of the summer classes is to catch them young, and this has been part of me. While I was doing my campaign, I mentioned about education advancement. I want to change the face of my local government in terms of education.

I want the state to know that my community, my students are educationally built.

"A total number of 500 and 800 participants were given free exercise books at the classes respectively. After a mock test at the end of the summer classes, anyone that scores good grade will

be offered free GCE form. Also, any of the student that made the english, mathematics and other five subjects will definitely get a free JAMB form. And if you are able to make JAMB mark cut off, I will assist you to make sure you secure university admission.

" But there is a difference in terms of that university education. My government will support science students whole heartedly with 100 percent full scholarship. I'll pay for their school fees from year one, and give them little stipend take care of them, to encourage those students to want to study sciences.

"Every year this administration will be giving out 100 forms. If at the end of the day, we're able to have 50 students that gain admission to study sciences, we can take care of them and offer them dull scholarship."

The council helmsmen emphasised that his administration would focused more on education empowerment, adding that he going to seek national and international donors for support.

"My predecessor has already built some roads and I want to focus on education. I'm working with national donor and other

donors from other areas to assist in getting the projects done. I'm not depending only on the IGR or money from the federal allocation".

Jimoh, who also revealed plan on how to prevent the students from involvement in vices, said arrangement would be made with artisans to engage the students in vocational trainings after school hours.

" I am going to discuss with artisans who are going to engage the students in vocational training after school hours. When they acquire the knowledge for three years, because not all of them that have the school certificate education that would want to further their education. So, with the vocational training, they can be self reliant and empowered and also become employers of labour.", the council helmsmen quipped

Commander Ofoyeju Stuns Edo Drug Traffickers, Arrests 47 Suspects

*** Seizes 40,000kg assorted illicit drugs**

*** Destroys 15.852 hectares of cannabis plantation**

Operatives of the Edo State Command of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) have continued to demystify the ranks of illicit drug traffickers, with a recent arrest of 47 suspected traffickers.

The breakthrough is consequent upon a coordinated clampdown on drug traffickers and raid on Ihama Road and other drug flashpoints within the state.

At least, nearly 40,000 kilograms of assorted illicit drugs were seized and 15.852 hectares of cannabis plantations destroyed during the operations.

The Edo State Commander Mitchell Ofoyeju made the disclosure in Benin City while presenting the command's scorecard for the month of July 2025.

According to Mitchell, the monthly activities covered several intelligence-led operations which resulted in the dislodgement of drug flashpoints in the state. "The July result reflects the ongoing



commitment to dismantling drug trafficking operations in the state. We apprehended 46 drug suspects, comprising 38 males and 8 females. A total of seven cannabis farms measuring 15.85 hectares across Oke Forest in Uhunmwonde and Ewere Forest in Uzebba, Owan West Local Government Areas, were destroyed. In all, we successfully took 39,983.294 kg of narcotic drugs out of illicit circulation.

The breakdown of the drugs is as follows: cannabis, 39,977.644 kg; psychotropic substances, 5.5753 kg; methamphetamine, 0.26 grammes; cocaine, 0.0598 grammes; and 5.8 litres of codeine syrup." Mitchell stated.

In addition to enforcement actions, the Edo State Command has been actively engaging the community through drug demand reduction initiatives. A total of 32 individuals with drug use problems received brief intervention counselling, while eleven others are currently undergoing rehabilitation in the command facility. The command equally organised multiple



sensitisation programmes throughout the month, reaching an impressive audience of over 8,000 individuals within the period under review. Among those arrested is a suspected drug baron and cannabis cultivator who has been on the command's wanted list since 2023. Alaba Monday, 49 years old, hails from Owan West local government area of the state. He was apprehended inside one of the cannabis farms, where eleven bags of processed cannabis weighing 115 kg were seized.

One Yusuf Isuku, 40 years old, who hails from Etsako West, was arrested along Wareke Road, Auchi, with 22 parcels of skunk, a strong variant of cannabis, weighing 10,265 kg. The drug was hidden inside garri in black bacco bags. Josiah Friday, 48 years old, who hails from Akoko Edo area of the state, was apprehended along Igara-Auchi Road in Igara with five bags of cannabis weighing 36 kg hidden inside black polythene.



Auchi Road with assorted psychotropic drugs. The suspect, who hails from Ishielu local government area of Ebonyi State, was found with 15,400 capsules of tramadol, 200 tablets of swinal, 357 tablets of molly and 54 bottles of codeine cough syrup. Similarly, some of the drug dealers arrested along the notorious Ihama Road, GRA

Benin City, include Emmanuel Onaji, 29 years old, from Ogbadibo local government area of Benue State, caught with molly, Joshua Paul,

21 years old, from Ovia North East, Edo State, was caught with Loud; Prosper Titus, 20 years old, from Gboko local government area of Benue State, was caught with Loud; Andy Obioma, 28 years old, from Kana local government of Rivers State; and Agu Emmanuel, 23 years old, from Kachia local government area of Kaduna State, was caught with Loud.

Commander of Narcotics, Mitchell Ofoyeju, reaffirmed the commitment of the Edo State Command to continue efforts against drug trafficking, vowing to prosecute those arrested and dismantle drug cartels that threaten the state's welfare.



Another interesting case is that of one Izunna Nwankwo, 26 years old, who was arrested along Benin-
